


Finished Measurements 40" x 40"




A combination of three blocks,

than it actually is.


These are the blocks needed for this project. All measurements are the unfinished measurements.

A half yard\* of each of the 5 fabrics should be enough, but it doesn't hurt to purchase more for those oops cutting moments. You will also need backing and binding fabric, and batting (wadding).


(4) 16.5" x 12.5" Court House Steps

(4) 8.5" x 8.5" 16 Patch Block





# Christmas Logs Under the Tree

cutout easier.



*Just add a 3" border and you have a 40" x 40" quilt.*
